- improve physical fitness and well being
- gain selection into the NZ Defence Force

Services Training & Education	Services related, a break down of options that may be used in delivery are noted in our course block syllabus.	1 - 4
Leadership Development	Leadership is an important part of service life, good leadership is encouraged. Mediums that may be used to develop this quality are noted in the course block syllabus.	1 - 4
Personal Physical Fitness	Physical fitness will always be an important component to service life and as such will always be encouraged. Students will be expected to participate and will only be excused on medical grounds. Be aware that academy staff may ask for a medical certificate to verify a condition. Sports and Recreation	Sports and Recreation are import tools used in the Academy to promote and foster team work and physical fitness. Representing College teams will be encouraged.
