	If you meet the eligibility criteria you don't need to do anything at this stage. When you complete your first eligible qualification, you will be able to make a claim through myIR on Inland Revenue's website. This will be available from 2026 onwards.		
	If you do not meet the eligibility criteria, you are not eligible for Fees Free in 2025.		
	What does Fees Free cover?		
	If you're eligible, Fees Free covers the fees for the final year of tertiary study or training in the first provider-based qualification or work-based programme you complete after 1 January 2025, up to \$12,000 including GST.		
	Fees Free will only cover the final year of one qualification or programme. If you didn't		
	use the \$12,000 entitlement for the final year of your first qualification or programme,		
	you won't be able to access Fees Free again for a second qualification or programme.		
Fees Free (2024 or earlier)	End of first-year Fees Free policy The Government has announced that Fees Free for the first year of study and training will finish at the end of 2024. It will be replaced by a final-year Fees Free policy. Learners who have already used Fees Free in their first year of study or training won't be able to access Fees Free under the new final-year policy. Māori Scholarships or Grants Information & Tip Sheet

Foreword

If you are looking at applying for Maori grants or scholarships then there are a range of things you will need to have and you can prepare them if applications have not opened yet. Here are some tips of what you can prepare now:

- A current or updated professional Curriculum Vitae.
- Copies of all your NCEA and or other education results.
- References or names of referees.
- A copy of your Course Enrolment Approval Letter with the title of the study programme
- A list of papers you intend to study with an invoice for the cost of your study on University Letterhead.
- A date stamped bank account with your name on it however you should do this last because the stamp date must be close to the date you submit your application.

Once you have this information you will have almost everything you need to submit an application which is normally done on line.

Iwi Maori

For iwi Maori scholarships or grants you might need proof of Maori ancestry from a Kaumatua (elder) or someone who has the ability to verify your ancestry on behalf of your iwi.

Some iwi may require you to register with them on line first which is a good option especially if you are a late learner student and have children. You can register yourself and your children and they can apply if they decide to study at university in the future.

This can also include adopted or step children because in the Maori world whangai, or adoption, is acknowledged and accepted as a legitimate form of whakapapa or ancestry. You will need to do some research into your whakapapa to find out which iwi scholarships you qualify for.

This grants are generally open in January with various closing dates. Please check your lwi websites.

Maori Land Trusts

There are also a range of Maori Land Trust Organisations that distribute grants annually to all descendants of those Maori who founded the trust. All you have to do is register your ancestry with them and produce proof of enrolment every year to qualify for their funding. You will need to do some research to find out if you are qualify for any of these.

Philanthropic Organisations

There are also a range of Philanthropic Organisations that distribute funding to Maori for example the Sir James Fletcher 2nd Memorial Trust (Fletcher Construction). This trust was part of the organisation that established the Tasman Pulp and Paper Mill in the in Kawerau in 1953 which was built on Maori land.

The trust distributes grants every year to anyone who has ancestry to the original Maori owners of the land. This trust alone distributes 100s of grants annually and the numbers applying are increasing every year. There are many trusts like this throughout the country but you will need to do some research to find out if you qualify for any of these.

Maori Scholarships and Grants

There are now a wide range of Maori scholarships and grants available these days and many are associated with Crown Agencies such as the Ministry of Health, Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Maori Development – Te Puni Kokiri. Some are also distributed through regional agencies like the District Health Boards. Many are now related to specific fields of study i.e. law, medicine, science, education, engineering, arts or humanities. You can only apply if you are studying in the field relevant to that scholarship.

Every university also offers various forms of funding support to Maori students too but they are usually in specialist areas and are highly contestable with large numbers of applicants. They are also assessed through academic results.

One of the longest serving Maori funding organisations is the Maori Education Trust which has gone through a number of structural management and governance changes over the years but has been around for a long time. You can access them at: https://maorieducation.org.nz/

Conclusion

There are many options for funding support if you are Maori studying at university but you need to have a field of study and have applied to one or many universities first. Once you have compiled the relevant information outlined in the first section of this information sheet you should get on line, do some research and find out what is available.

You should also apply for as many scholarships as you can and then assess your results. Some scholarships will allow you to receive iwi Maori grants because you are entitled to them through your ancestry but you should check this first. The main point here is you should not limit your options especially when it comes to iwi Maori support funding you are legally entitled to.
