What?


- Purpose: share findings, test recommendations, gather feedback
- Based on key informant engagement and literature review

Why?

- High SME failure rates in NZ construction & infrastructure
- Many tradespeople have strong technical skills but lack business skills
- Industry impact: stability, quality, workforce retention

Industry context – key stats

- Construction = 6.3% GDP, 10.7% of workforce (MBIE, 2023)
- Only 29% of construction businesses from 2014 still operating in 2023
- Over 1/3 of new builds fail final inspection (OneRoof, 2025)
- Mental health: 7% of working-age male suicides in construction (BRANZ)




Stakeholder narratives - summary

- 1. Why SMEs fail: cultural norms, poor cashflow/pricing, boom-bust unpreparedness
- 2. VET's role: teach business/people management pre-business ownership
- 3. Skills gaps: pricing, PM, compliance, awareness
- 4. German Meister parallels: business credentialing, teaching authority
- 5. Minimum business requirements: licensing, readiness checks

Recommendations

- VET recommendations
 - Stackable micro-credentials towards higher trade qualification: technical expertise, business knowledge, teaching/mentorship
 - Optional business strand in apprenticeships
 - Trade-specific content to fill current VET gaps

- Non-education recommendations
 - Business-readiness licensing model
 - Mandatory tax literacy module before GST registration



- Help refine recommendations for sector fit
- Identify potential pilot opportunities
- Partner to implement solutions
