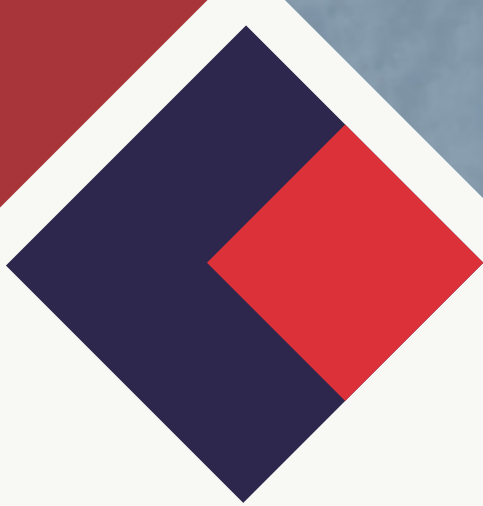

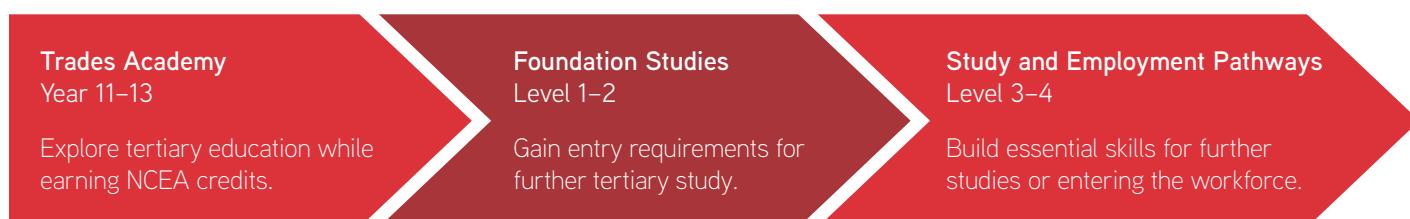
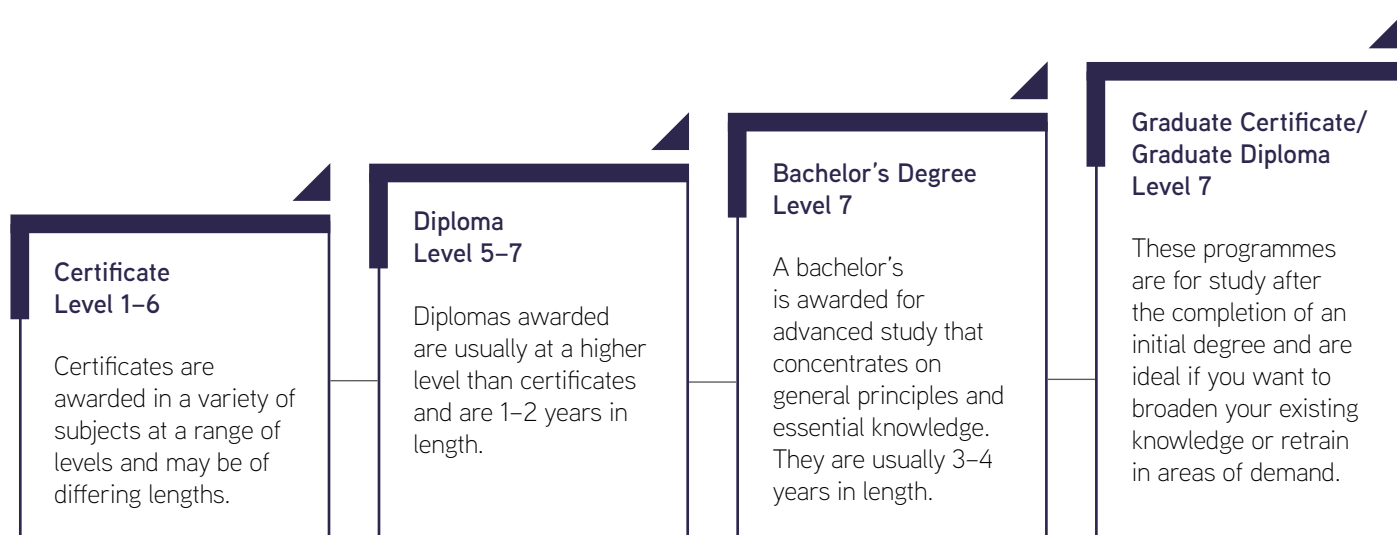

UNDERSTANDING QUALIFICATIONS

The New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) is comprised of ten levels and covers a range of qualifications. The levels are based on how complex the learning is; with one being the most basic, through to ten being the most complex. MIT offers programmes up to level seven.



Key Terms

Programmes and Courses	A programme results in a qualification and consists of a number of courses. Some programmes consist of compulsory courses while others have a selection of elective courses or a combination.
Credits	Courses consist of credits, and when a course is successfully completed, the credits will be counted towards the qualification. One credit usually equals 10–12 hours of learning.
Levels	Levels indicate the depth of knowledge and complexity of skills required. The higher the level, the more complex the concepts and skills required. In New Zealand, the levels progress from Level 1 to Level 10.
Entry Requirements	Most programmes have minimum entry requirements. Please refer to manukau.ac.nz for information on each programme's specific entry criteria.
Open Entry	Certain programmes offered by MIT are 'open entry', meaning they do not require NCEA or similar for you to enrol. Visit manukau.ac.nz/open-entry for a full list.
Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)	Your previous work experience, volunteering, professional development or other providers' qualifications can be recognised as prior learning and matched against credits in our courses. Visit manukau.ac.nz/RPL for more information.

FUNDING YOUR STUDY

Student loans

A student loan helps to pay for your course fees, study materials (e.g. books, tools, laptop) and living costs. This is money you will have to pay back in the future.

You don't need to be studying full-time, but there are minimum amounts of study required to be eligible. There are also residency requirements you will need to meet to be able to apply for a student loan and if you're under 18, one of your parents also needs to give their permission.

Student allowances

A student allowance is a weekly payment that you may be able to get to help with your living expenses while studying.

Unlike a student loan, you don't have to pay the money back, but how much you are able to get will depend on your income, living situation and your parents' income (if you're under 24 years old). If you get a student allowance, you may also be eligible for an accommodation benefit. StudyLink will determine this when you apply.
